future events. This year we will review to see if there is anything we can do better or differently for future Hamfests. For those not aware, our current venue of Lorain County Community College has kept our cost pretty much the same for many years. This will change starting with NOARS Winter Hamfest in 2025. We will have a significant increase in the venue fee along with a new set-up, concession, and room rental (for VE testing) fees. Our goal is to continue to provide this resource to the amateur radio community in the most cost-effective way to attendees as well as the club.

From the shack front, I participated in the 13 Colonies event, earning a clean sweep in SSB and Digital modes with all bonus stations. I can say it helped that I started day one to get most of what was needed and continued through the week. For those of you who also participated or listened, I was very disappointed, again, in the operating etiquette of some amateur radio stations answering the CQ. I am not sure if they were calling and couldn't hear or what was going on. I don't think it is that hard to go by the numbers or not call over someone else who is being called. Even after being called out on what they were doing, they continued on without a care, knowing you could identify them by call sign. Of course, there were also the jokers who wanted to ruin it for everyone because they were either upset with their inability to get in, don't like contests or special events on their bands or something else, and would just cause interference in some way, like constantly humming, tuning their antenna or something else. Some of this made it especially hard for those like me, only running 100

watts on SSB. At least for this event, following the spots did help and staying patient and listening to the instructions paid off during a pileup. Surprisingly, I had the SSB sweep before digital. I also did the ARRL IARU-HF SSB which was definitely a lot better from the etiquette standpoint, and I beat my scores from previous years, which was really my goal. Considering band conditions the past few months, being up and down or non-existent, it went better than I thought and was a lot of fun. Speaking of band conditions, the other day I had some time and was doing FT8 mid-morning and things were going well; 15m, 17m and 20m seemed to be decent and open outside the US when all of a sudden everything went silent except for a few digital CQ's coming through. At first, I thought, OK, what did I do? I must have hit something, or my antenna has an issue. I started to look around and try different things with the same result. Searching the bands showed there was really no SSB traffic and only a few digital or none on each band. Luckily, I had Ham Clock running, showing live spots for my grid square every 15 minutes. Well, I saw the numbers drop from hundreds to single digits and the map clear out as well. Phew! It wasn't just me, but conditions, sunspots and space weather. This lasted about 45 minutes and then the bands picked up again.

Remember, the August meeting will be the Annual Picnic at South Central Park in North Ridgeville, Ohio. Check out the website for all the details and I hope to see you there.

Hams Who Can

Jeany, KC3QND sent this recipe for corn relish, which she got from her mother, Twila.

Corn Relish

- 12-18 ears corn
- 4 small onions
- 1 small cabbage
- 2 sweet red peppers
- 2 tablespoons salt
- 4 cups sugar
- ½ cup flour
- 1 tablespoon mustard
- 1 tablespoon turmeric
- 4 cups vinegar

Chop onions, cabbage, and peppers. Sprinkle with the salt and set overnight.

Cook corn five minutes and add to the ingredients that sat overnight.



In a large pan, add the sugar, flour, mustard, and turmeric. Add a little vinegar to make a paste, then add the rest until thick.

Add vegetables and bring to a boil. Seal in jars.

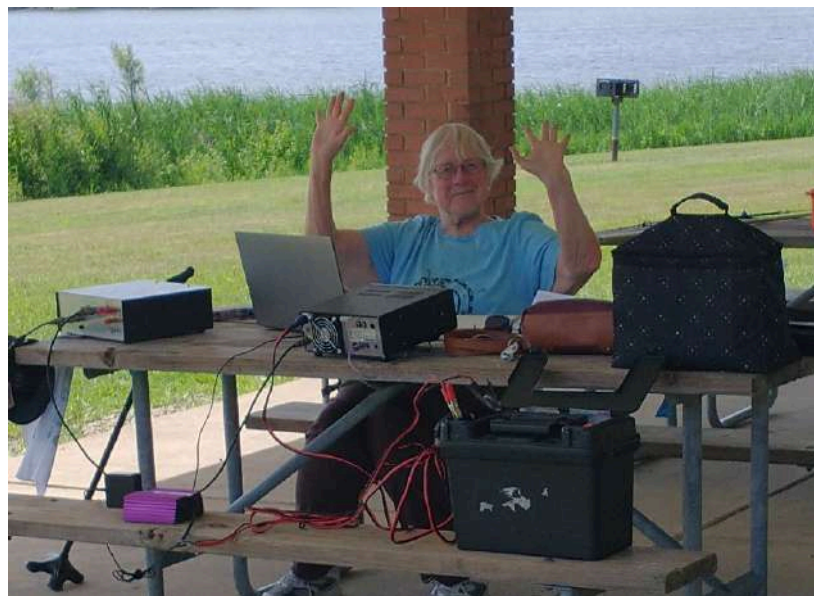

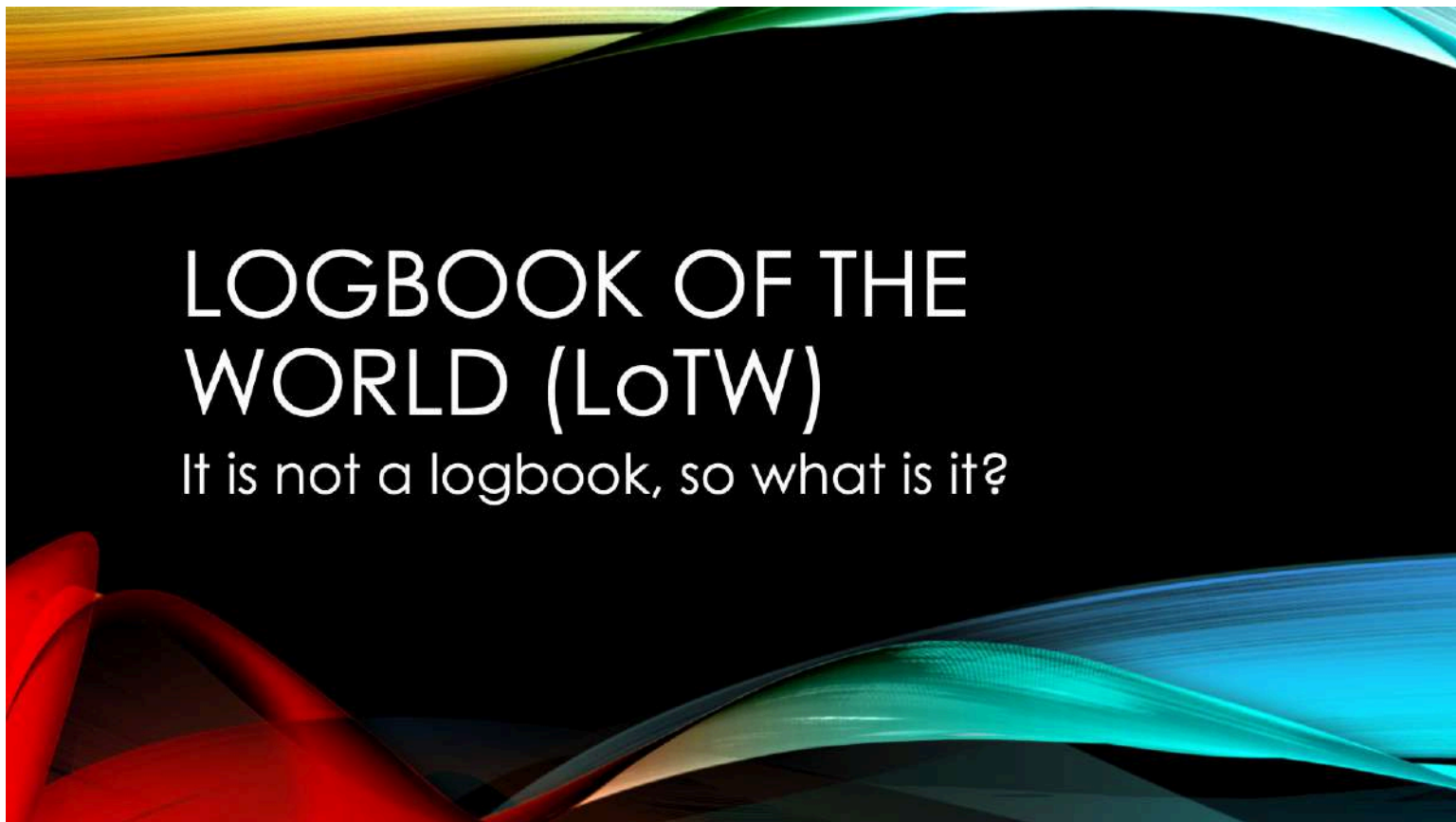
