last half hour, calling CQ and handling the calls coming in.

Another shack project this month was initiated because of a home improvement project. Specifically, roof work, luckily not by me. Recently I acquired a RigExpert AA-35 Zoom, which was on sale during the Ohio Tax Holiday. Before the work started, I used it and AntScope to map out the SWR on all the bands the EFHW works with. Since I also have a Nano VNA, I did the same with its software. If you read my Field Day story about the Nano VNA, you would know my last experience with it. I can say that although they both did the job in the end, the RigExpert was so much easier to set up, use, and compare results. Since my antenna is in the attic (HOA) and hung

up with cable clips, once the project was done, I went into the attic to make sure everything was good. Good thing I did, as some of the wire had come loose and had slipped out of the holders. After putting everything back where it should be, I used the Rig Expert and AntScope and verified in record time that the SWR was comparable to the previous reading. The RigExpert will definitely be more efficient in setting up my portable antenna if I actually do ever get out and activate POTA.

I hope everyone has recovered from the early August storms. If you joined us for some of the nets, this led to a great discussion on Home and Shack disaster recovery plans. If you didn't, then I hope to hear you on future nets as you never know what you may learn.

Proposed Amendment to the NOARS Constitution and By-Laws

Background

Four years ago, NOARS changed the officers' terms of office from one year to two years. It may be easier to find people to run for office if the terms were not two years. Two years is a big commitment. The board is presenting the following.

Proposed Changes to the Constitution

Under Board of Directors # 2, change from:

"2. Should a vacancy exist after appointments are made, the President may select and appoint full members to serve as Directors for a period not to exceed two (2) years. The term of a Director appointed from the membership will be commensurate with the president's term in office, and must be appointed bi-annually."

To Read as follows:

2. Should a vacancy exist after appointments are made, the President may select and appoint full members to serve as Directors for a period not to exceed one (1) year. The term of a Director, appointed from the membership, will be commensurate with the president's term in office, and must be appointed annually."

Under Officers #2, change from:

"2. Officers shall be elected annually in accordance with Article VII of the By-laws, for a term of two years. Only Full Members in good standing shall be eligible to be officers."

To Read as follows:

"2. Officers shall be elected annually in accordance with Article VII of the By-laws, for a term of one year. Only Full Members in good standing shall be eligible to be officers."

Proposed Changes to the By-

Laws

Update Article VII, ELECTION OF OFFICERS, change from:

"In addition to the restrictions in Article III, a candidate for office must be a member in good standing and must have attended at least four (4) meetings during the previous 12 months. Terms of office shall run for a two (2) year period with President and Vice President being elected in even numbered years, Secretary and Treasurer being elected in odd numbered years. The current President and Vice President may not run for reelection if he/she has held that office the two previous consecutive terms."

To Read as Follows:

"In addition to the restrictions in Article III, a candidate for office must be a member in good standing and must have attended at least four (4) meetings during the previous 12 months. Terms of office shall run for a one (1) year period for all officers. The current President and Vice President may not run for reelection if he/she has held that office for the four previous consecutive terms."

Update Article VII ELECTION OF OFFICERS Add the Paragraph as Follows:

For the transition from two-year term to one-year term in the election held in November 2024, the current Treasurer and Secretary will not be required to run for office and will continue in the second year of their term. The Treasurer and Secretary positions will be a one-year term in the 2025 election and beyond. The president and vice-president positions will be a one-year term starting with the 2024 election.

"b) The committee will select a slate of candidates for the offices consisting of at least two nominees for each office. If a Candidate runs unopposed whether as a nominee to an office, or an existing officer, with the exception of the president or vice-president ending a second term, that candidate shall be considered nominated and the balloting procedure shall continue as specified herein. At the regular business meeting in October, the chairman will present the slate of nominees for each office.

Each nominee must have given prior consent to run."

To Read as Follows:

b) The committee will select a slate of candidates for the offices consisting of at least two nominees for each office. If a Candidate runs unopposed whether as a nominee to an office, or an existing officer, with the exception of the president or vice-president ending a fourth term, that candidate shall be considered nominated and the balloting procedure shall continue as specified herein. At the regular business meeting in October, the chairman will present the slate of nominees for each office. Each nominee must have given prior consent to run."



except for major holidays, such as Christmas. You are always welcome to join us at the Golden Corral on West River Road in Elyria at noon.








